Myanmar's first modern construction supply warehouse for home owners and construction companies is now open for business in Yangon. The shop, Pro1 Home Center, opened its doors in Insein township on January 7, boasting an extensive stock of construction materials and international brands from roofing to flooring and various high-quality SCG products. U Myo Htwe, chair of the Pro1 Home Center, said that such a shop was necessary in order to supplement increasing development projects in Yangon. "The demand for construction materials is high because of international investment," U Myo Htwe said. "We tried ... to meet every requirement of the customers." "Foreign business partners asked whether there was any one-stop service home center in Myanmar like other countries have," he said. Opening the store was not an easy process. The project, said U Myo Htwe, has been in the works for two years and is a public-private partnership with the government.

Growth in Myanmar's Construction & Building Industry Signify Opportunities in the Tools, Hardware and Bolts & Nuts Industry The Myanmar construction industry increased in value at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 11.48% during the review period (2007-2011). This growth was supported by the country's improving political stability, increasing number of investment opportunities in energy and public infrastructure projects, and rapid inflow of foreign direct investment (FDI) from Vietnam, Thailand, China, Singapore and Malaysia. The construction industry growth is expected to remain strong over the forecast period, driven by the government's increasing expenditure on improving Myanmar's public infrastructure, and the rising interest of domestic and foreign real estate developers on constructing residential units to meet the population's huge housing demand. The infrastructure and residential construction markets together generated 77.3% of the total Myanmar construction industry value in 2011, and the contribution of these two markets to the overall Myanmar construction industry growth will be significant over the forecast period. It is anticipated that the construction industry will increase in value at a CAGR of 7.84% over the forecast period.

According to the report "Construction in Myanmar - Key Trends and Opportunities to 2016" by Timetric, the commercial construction market recorded a CAGR of 8.09% during the review period. This growth was mainly driven by the leisure and hospitality and office buildings categories, which together accounted for 67.2% of the commercial construction market value in 2011. Furthermore, since the 2013 Southeast Asian Games (SEA Games) and 2014 Asian Summit will be held in Myanmar, the demand for hotel and land has started rising in cities such as Yangon in preparation for the anticipated influx of foreign investors and tourists to the country. Timetric expects the commercial construction market will register a CAGR of 8.01% over the forecast period. The contribution from tourism will be significant to the Myanmar commercial construction activity over the forecast period, which will also be significant for the correlated HVAC and building maintenance industry.

\$94m development in Myanmar's Star City

Yoma Strategic Holdings Ltd. (Yoma) announced that it has through its wholly-owned subsidiary SPA Project Management Pte. Ltd. (SPA PM) entered into a shareholder's agreement to form a joint venture with Dragages Singapore Pte Ltd (DSPL) to construct 1,043 units of Zone B of Thanlyin Star City in Myanmar, which is 70% beneficially owned by the Group.

Fragrant To Build Mega Property in Myanmar

In a bid to grow its presence in Myanmar, Fragrant Property will invest US\$300 million (S\$373.59 million) in the emerging country. The firm set aside an initial budget of about US\$40 million (S\$49.81 million) to register two subsidiaries - Myanmar Fragrant and Myanmar Fragrant Development - which will undertake real estate projects in the country. These include general utilities, city planning and electric train systems.

Vietnam Companies Builds New brick factory in Myanmar

Vietnam is taking steps to build its influence in Myanmar - literally. In mid-June, representatives of several Vietnamese firms signed joint venture agreements with construction companies to build brick factories here. U Soe Min Naing, director of Shine Group of Companies, said his firm had agreed to jointly develop a US\$10 million brick factory outside either Yangon or Nay Pyi Taw with Viglacera Corporation that will produce a "massive" amount of bricks every year.
